BUREAU OF NAVIGATION NEWS BULLETIN #75.

The Bureau requests that this Bulletin be given free circulation among officers and that items of interests be published to the Enlisted Personnel. 1. Uniform - Navy Recruiters' School. Officers ordered to Navy Recruiters' Schools for instruction prior to assignment to recruiting duty should have Service Uniforms with them.

Enlisted men require a full outfit of bedding and clothing, and Commanding Officers should accordingly inform men so ordered.

2. Navy Relief Society. The forthcoming annual report of the Navy Relief Society for the year 1926, will show an expenditure of \$55,957 for financial aid extended to the widows, children, or other dependents of naval and marine personnel who have died in service. This amount represents only the sums sent out from the Society's headquarters at Washington to individuals scattered throughout the country. In addition there have been large local donations by the "Auxiliaries" established in the vicinity of some twenty naval bases, where the families of men and officers are more concentrated.

The outright donations of funds from Headquarters were divided among dependent heirs as follows:

15 Commissioned Officers	\$3520.00
6 Warrant Officers	1686.00
184 Enlisted Men	30,752.00

In addition expenditures on account of education were made as follows:

2 Officers' Children	\$619.00
9 Enlisted Men's Children	1940.00

The total expenditures from Headquarters including money issued to Auxiliaries for local distribution by them amounted to nearly \$55,000.00.

The Navy Relief Society is a purely unofficial organization incorporated to relieve temporary distress in the frequent cases of the Naval and Marine families who may be in temporary want after the sudden and unexpected death of their bread earners in service. The ability of the Society to meet such needs for temporary aid, is largely dependent upon the annual contribution of the Service itself. The Bureau bespeaks the hearty support of the Service in this most worthy Service charity.

During 1926 such contributions received from 162 ships of the Navy. The twenty ships contributing the largest amounts are shown below:

3. Navy Training Courses. Navy Training Courses covering the ratings of Seaman Signalman, Signalman Third class, Storekeeper second class, "A to N", and Apprentice Seaman have been received from the printers. Request for a supply of these courses, with exception of Apprentice Seaman, may now be forwarded.

The Bureau considers that training stations are the proper distributing centers for the Apprentice Seaman courses, and copies are being sent to other ships and stations for reference only.

Training Course for Gunner's Mate third class has been reprinted, and training course English for Enlisted Men has been brought down to date, reprinted, and will be known as "Good English for Everyday Use."

Training course for Ship's Cook third class will be ready for issue within a few weeks, as will training course for Radioman second class, Assignments 1-12 and 19-24, and training course for Radioman third class, Assignments 13-24.

The Bureau also has a limited supply of courses in Letter Writing and Ancient, Medieval and Modern history for which requests may be submitted.
